# On Campus Engagement

## IAEP Certificates

Internal Audit and related courses are thriving at KSU. To earn the IAEP Certificate, students must complete five courses including Accounting Information Systems, Auditing and Assurance, Accounting Data Analytics, Fraud and Forensic Accounting, and Internal Auditing.

We issued a record 95 IAEP Certificates this year. This is an increase of over 30% from a record 72 certificate awards last year. In 2020-2021, 69 students successfully completed the necessary undergraduate courses to earn the IAEP Certificate awarded by the Institute of Internal Auditors. Additionally, 26 students completed the Master of Accounting specializing in Audit/Advisory and earned their IAEP Certificate.

## IIA Awareness day

Kennesaw hosted the 2nd Annual IIA Awareness Day in August 2020 via a virtual platform. This was an opportunity for KSU students (majoring in accounting, finance or information systems) to learn more about career paths in internal audit/advisory. Although we had some technology challenges, both professionals and students worked with us to pivot on the fly to connect over a dozen professionals with over 30 students.

## IA/Advisory Student Day

In January 2021, Kennesaw hosted the 15th Annual IA/Advisory Student Day and Career Fair via Zoom. 14 firms and 80 students attended the event. . Twelve schools around Georgia were represented with students. Students had the opportunity to rotate between firms with the help of several MAcc students volunteering as moderators. This is our biggest event all year and it was a huge success. One employer was planning on hiring one intern, and they reported that they expanded to two interns with the quality of students in attendance. We plan on having more firms and students attend in the future!

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## Internal Audit Social

In April 2021, the Internal Auditing Student Organization held the first Internal Audit Social. This was an informal opportunity for Kennesaw State undergraduate students to hear from professionals in Internal Audit. This was an interactive day where the professionals participated on a panel to share their experiences within Internal Audit. As a part of the panel, the professionals had a competition to see who had the “craziest” internal audit story. Congratulations to Doug Bohmer (Norfolk Southern) for having the best story. We feel that this event was a great way to pique the interest of internal audit in students who are still trying to figure out which way they would like to go with their career. We look forward to growing this event in the years to come!

## Internal Audit Student Organization

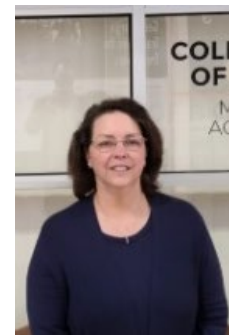

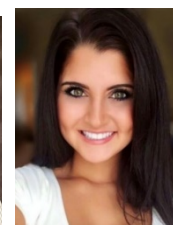

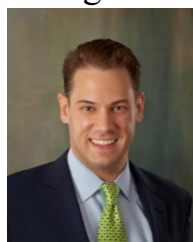

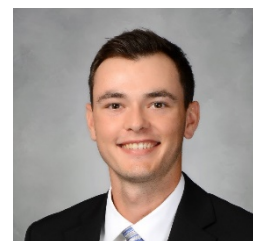
## Research Rankings

KSU ranks 67 overall worldwide in the past 6 years in academic publications in the top 12 journals. Within the areas of auditing and education, KSU ranks 5<sup>th</sup> in education scholarship and 30<sup>th</sup> in auditing (source 2020 BYU rankings).

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## Direct financial support in grants and Scholarships

The IIA Global Headquarters through the Internal Audit Foundation continued to financially support the program with an \$11,000 grant to support a student working in the Internal Audit Center for the 2020-2021 academic year. This grant allowed Jake McWhorter to work with the center director to accomplish the many activities and functions listed in this newsletter. We appreciate his efforts and wish him well as he starts his career with KPMG.
