## **Course Pairs:**

Students who are accepted to the Double Owls Pathway have the option to enroll in the following three (3) courses, to equate to 9 total credit hours:

- MSCM 7210: Conflict Theory (3 credit hours) to count for Upper Division Electives
- MSCM 7220: Negotiation Theory (3 credit hours) to count for Upper Division Electives
- MSCM 7400: Research Methods (3 credit hours) to count for Upper Division Electives

MSCM 7000-level coursework will be used to satisfy first semester MSCM requirements and may be used toward 9 of the 12 required credit hours in the BS in ANTH Upper Division Electives degree requirement.
