<p>City as Text is an interdisciplinary investigation of the people, architecture, culture, history, and changing demographics of Savannah, GA. During the two-week Maymester, students will first travel to Savannah May 12-15 to experience the city and complete reflective assignments. In the second week, students will meet online to further discuss their experiences and present summary findings about their learned experiences. HON 2400/W02 (0 credit hour)	Honors Discovery: Longleaf Pine Ecosystem	52790	Terri Collins and Leigh Funk	All day, May 18-23 (Maymester)
<p>This course is a 5-day field lab in beautiful Moody Forest located in the coastal planes of south Georgia. Students will engage in hands-on learning experiences exploring conservation and environmental practices necessary to maintain a healthy ecosystem. Specifically, students will investigate the history of long-leaf pines, keystone species such as the Gopher Tortoise, endangered/threatened flora and fauna, and environmental considerations.</p> <p>This course will meet May 18-23 and has limited seats. <p>This course is a 6-day field lab in beautiful Wassaw Island which is small island off the coast of Savannah. Students will engage in hands-on learning experiences working with the Caretta Research Project which protects Georgia's sea turtles. During this week, you will learn about Loggerhead sea turtles, nesting and hatching</p>				

practices, sea turtle and coastal conservation strategies to maintain a healthy ecosystem.

<p>Livestreaming now includes live demonstrations, interviews, podcasting, and of course playing video games. In this Honors Discovery class, you will learn what goes on behind the scenes to create a successful livestream event or weekly show. <p>An Honors Applied Learning Experience is a way to acquire hands-on experience related to your major in a meaningful way that is less formal than an internship. At least 48 hours of applied learning experiences are required, along with a written proposal due three days prior to the end of the add/drop period and a written report and reflection on the experience by the final class day of the semester.</p>

<p>This course enables Honors students to earn course credit and gain hands-on experience by assisting a professor with his or her research. Students work one-on-one within their major field or within a closely related field doing primary and/or secondary research for a research project conducted by the instructor.
