


Double Owl pathways in ISYE

Step 2 To apply for a Double Owl Pathway or submit an interest request, navigate to [Owl Express](#) and locate the main menu → Student Services.

Step 3 Your application or interest will be saved and forwarded to the appropriate staff for review. Contact the graduate program coordinator to discuss course selection once your pathway application is approved.
