This funding request is for the expense of tickets and travel. Discussion- Graduating students cannot attend this event due the date of the event. Graduating seniors will no longer be current KSU students and therefore SABAC cannot fund their participation.

Rationale- After commencement seniors are no longer current KSU students.

Mostly delivery charges for EVM rented equipment. Do you have an updated quote from EVM? No, we do not have a quote from EVM. The pricing was

calculated off pricing data from the EVM website. An EVM quote will be necessary to process the payment. Is there a way to make sure that only KSU students are eating? It is stated in the information that we sent out, that all teams are supposed to provide their own food. We can re-state it to the teams that are coming.

Discussion- We need a quote from EVM on this one. The amount requested was updated to \$4950.00. How can we expect them to control the food going to KSU students. We could have a tap-in location at the food station. We could have a list or give a token to redeem food. The tap-in seems like it would work. There would be 2 conditions for this request; 1. A tap-in for food and 2. An EVM quote.

Rationale- None

Charlene Johnson proposed the **motion to approve in the amount of \$4950.00 with the condition** they utilize tap-in for food serve to ensure only KSU students receive refreshments and a quote from EVM, seconded by Krishna Chaitanya Naraparaju.

No. Who would be able to attend? 11 Members only. Will you be seeking reimbursement from SABAC? No, we will receive funds first. Do you have a quote from the hotel? Yes, 2 rooms totaling \$726.96. \$255.00 to help with hotel costs and the remaining \$471.96 for students to pay.

Discussion- Members only is okay with travel requests. Is it okay to include the total lodging expense? Have they requested any travel for this year? No. They are eligible for the max \$5000.00 per year. Is there a reason 12 people going and there are just 2 hotel rooms? Is there a reason they did not factor that in? SABAC can revise this based on their judgement. If they have the funds why not make people more comfortable. The \$225.00 of the 726.96 of the hotel costs seems like not enough. They will have to ask students to fund the additional amount and they may need additional rooms which would make the cost go up even more. They may have additional events coming up but they do not have any more supplemental meetings with which to request more funds. They may have money in their accounts. There club may have purchased the rooms already. They are not on the call for us to ask. So SABAC can make that decision.

Rationale- SABAC does not feel like the hotel amount is adequate. So we are including the entire hotel cost as presented.

Charlene Johnson proposed the motion to approve in the amount of \$1551.96 with the condition that the hotel has not already been paid for, seconded by Zoe Derr.
